OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAM:

- > to provide local residents with basic knowledge and practical skills to open opportunities to participate in Blue Economy Projects;
- > mentally connect local people to the ocean, with an understanding of marine ecosystem processes and human impacts at national and personal levels;
- > to increase the involvement of local people and communities in the processes and activities for the preservation of marine ecosystems.

It was planned to involve at least 50 people

Requirements for participants:

- to be a resident of the South East of Mauritius
- over 18 years old;
- swimming ability;
- no problems with heart and/or lung, asthma or epilepsy





RESULTS OF THE PROGRAM

3 batches during May-August 2022





The programme has fully achieved its objectives:

All planned activities have been implemented:

- ✓ Theoretical and practical scuba diving sessions on CMAS Level 1 standards;
- ✓ A lecture on Constitution Law in Mauritius;
- ✓ An introduction to marine ecosystems and biodiversity in Mauritius;
- ✓ Whale-watching trip including lecture on sustainable and responsible ecotourism.

The number of beneficiaries is 10% higher than planned.





PROGRAM IMPACT

We believe that the programme will have an impact in the short, medium and long term through:

- Involving local communities in the conservation and responsible use of natural resources;
- Transmission of the knowledge and principles of responsibile attitude to younger generations through families;
- Uniting local communities;
- Providing a basis that opens up perspectives for participating in Blue Economy projects;
- Promoting aquatic activities among local communities as well as domestic tourism.





INSTEAD OF CONCLUSION

During the Program the participants were asked the question: what steps should be taken to protect the marine ecosystems in Mauritius? And the most popular answers were:

Improvement of law enforcement – 59 %

More educational programs for locals – 56 %
